TOWN CENTRE NORTH – CONSULTATION UPDATE

Harlow Town Centre is on the verge of an exciting transformation. Development plans are currently being prepared to provide major new shops, homes, a hotel, entertainment facilities and new public open spaces within the town centre.

The plans are being drawn up by a range of partners including Harlow Council, the major international developer Stockland, and Harlow Renaissance, among others.

The planned regeneration is known as Harlow Town Centre North and it is set to improve the quality and attractiveness of Harlow's shopping experience and its entertainment offer. It will provide the change necessary to make the town a place where more people choose to live, work and shop.

A public exhibition on the first stage of the plans was held in July 2009 in the town centre and gave local people the opportunity to view the proposals and to comment on the emerging ideas.

Once consultation on the proposals is complete and all of the feedback on the

scheme has been reviewed, a planning application for Harlow Town Centre North will be prepared and submitted to Harlow Council. This is likely to be in summer 2010. Should this be approved, the first stages of development could be completed within three years.

Although the official deadline for responding to these plans has now passed, discussions will be ongoing over the next few months and we would be pleased to hear your views on these exciting proposals.
